This easy game is a fun way to get ready for Thanksgiving while also prompting our young children to be thoughtful about all the blessings God has already given them!


Materials:

Thanksgiving Turkey Hunt Game Pieces
White cardstock paper (recommended)
Scissors
Marker/Pen
Reward/Treat (optional)




Instructions:

- 1. Print out all the game pages onto white cardstock paper (recommended for sturdiness).
 - 2. Cut out the colored turkeys.
 - 3. Staple the "Turkey Hunt Pages" together.
- 4. Using a maker or pen, fill in the certificate with your child's name, the date, and your "signature".
- 5. Pick a reward/treat for finishing the game (completely optional the certificate can be the reward on its own too!)









6. Play the game!


Instructions:


Before playing, hide the turkeys in their designated places based on the "Turkey Hunt" instructions (Red Turkey should be hidden somewhere in your child's bedroom, Orange in a Bible, Yellow in the kitchen, Green in the laundry room, Blue in the family/living room, and Brown on the front door. The certificate should be placed in your mailbox - along with an extra reward/treat if you're using one in addition to the certificate).


Give your child a pen and the "Thanksgiving Turkey Hunt" pages. Have them follow the instructions in each box/section, sharing the instructions of what they are thankful for and then marking off the "Share" box in that section. They should then head to the indicated room/place to "hunt" for that colored turkey. Once in that room, a game of "hot" and "cold" will be played to help them find the turkey's location. As they move through the room, use words like "warmer" and "colder" to indicate if they are getting closer to the turkey or further away. Once they find that turkey, mark the "Find" box and move on to the next section.


The final box has them share 3 things they are thankful for before going to the mailbox to collect their certificate and their reward/treat (if using one).




















Share something you love about the place where you live. Head to your bedroom to find where the red turkey hides.






God gives us so many tasty things to enjoy. Share some of your favorite foods to eat. Head to the kitchen to find where the yellow turkey hides.



Share the names of all the special people in your family. Head to the laundry room to find where the green turkey hides.




It is a special gift to be part of the family of God. Share your favorite part of going to church. Head to the living/family room to find where the blue turkey hides.

Share your favorite things to do or see outside. Head to the front door to find where the brown turkey hides.


